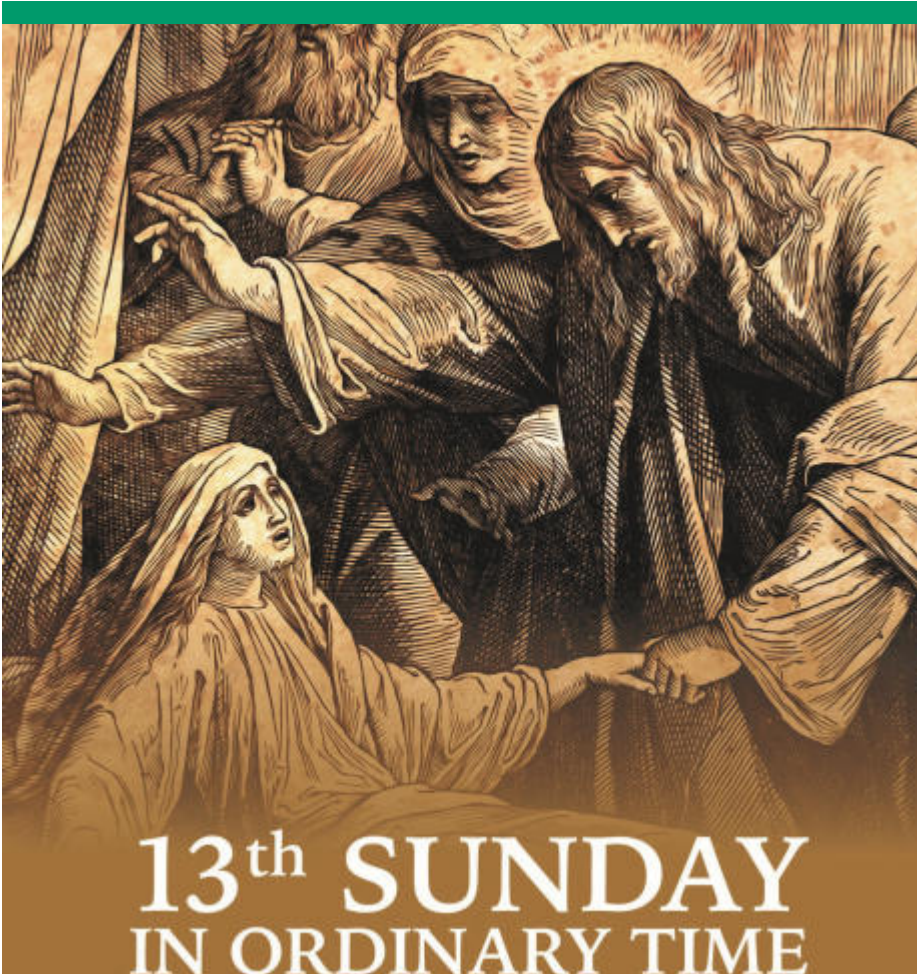

2018 Pastoral Council Elections

Wonderful people are serving on the parish Pastoral Council: Chuck Berendes (Chair), Deacon Richard Sage, Bill Brendel, Sue Halter, Linda Schwartz, Joan Weissenberger, Bob Mahr, Dave Wagner (representative from the parish Finance Council), Lori Meyer (parish representative to Aquinas Catholic Schools), Pattie Nimocks (New President of PCCW), and Jared Leis (New President of Men's Club).

A Pastoral Council is a consultative body which advises the pastor so he can make informed decisions. Even though a pastor relies on the advice of the members of the Pastoral Council, it's important that everyone has a voice in the life of the parish. To offer this opportunity, we will have elections on September 22-23 so you can actively choose fellow parishioners to be your representatives. Every registered member who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation and who attends Mass that weekend will be asked to vote for two new members. You will be asked to fill the positions currently held by Linda Schwartz and Chuck Berendes.

If you would like to take a more active role in offering direction for our parish, I ask you to consider running for election. It is important to have a variety of members serving on the council in order to have a healthy cross-section of our members. You can be single, married, divorced or widowed. It's only necessary that you are a practicing Catholic, registered at Mary Mother of the Church, have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, and are at least 18 years old. We will not have any campaigning. We will simply offer a brief biography on each candidate which will be posted in the bulletin three weeks before elections.

What does membership on the council entail? We have about 4 meetings each year to consider a variety of topics concerning pastoral planning: Sacred Worship, Faith Formation (including Aquinas Catholic Schools), Outreach, Finance, Stewardship, and Buildings & Grounds. Council members are asked to provide me with insight into understanding the parish and to identify needs. They also offer me an opportunity to share my own ideas and to seek advice. From time to time, council members are also asked to lead in certain tasks of parish service. We have our quarterly meetings typically on the 3rd Thursday of the month at 6:00 pm. Terms last for three years and you are invited to consider re-election after your three years are completed. If you are interested or if you want to learn more about this opportunity to serve your parish please call me or the other members of the Election Committee:

Those who are nominated will be asked to attend a group information meeting on Tuesday, August 7 at 6:00 – 6:45 pm to learn more about the responsibilities of being a member of the Pastoral Council. (This meeting is not mandatory.) Then each person will have a few days to decide if he or she wants to run for election.

Parish HALL Rental Policy

Over the past few months we have been working on drafts of a **Rental Policy** for our new Parish Hall and Religious Education Center. We have solicited input from several outside organizations and individuals who rent or contract these facilities, and have reviewed drafts with our Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Committee, BOFT Commission, and parish staff. We have developed a policy that will be effective July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019. We have specifically stated a term of one year for the policy with the intention to be able to review, refine, and modify the policy after we have had some experience renting out the facility.

Our Parish Hall and Religious Education Center was built to serve the mission of Jesus Christ as lived at Mary, Mother of the Church Parish. Accordingly, scheduling priority for the Parish Hall and Religious Education Center is given to Mary, Mother of the Church Parish events, organizations, and registered parishioner requests. The priority of use will be:

- A. Parish Events and Parish Organizations of Mary, Mother of the Church (includes funeral luncheons and baptism luncheons)
- B. Registered parishioners of Mary, Mother of the Church
- C. Diocese of La Crosse and its organizations (i.e. as named in the Official Catholic Directory or Wisconsin Pastoral Handbook)
- D. Not-for-Profit organizations with missions that agree with Catholic teaching

We have intentionally decided not to rent at this time to commercial organizations or to private parties not fitting the above criteria. The principle reason is that we have already received many requests and we don't want to inhibit our own parish activities. For example, we have already made commitments to the FSPA for a 3 day rental in July; the DCCW for their Leadership Conference in August; Aquinas Catholic Schools for their fall Teacher In-Service; the Diocese for their regional New Teacher In-Service; and the FSPA Affiliates for their fall conference. In addition, the Catholic Daughters of the Americas have scheduled an event on December 12 and the Knights of Columbus have expressed interest as well. Having a new parish hall in the city has generated a lot of interest (and curiosity)!

We have decided the Parish Hall is NOT available for Saturday afternoon wedding receptions due to regular parish use on weekends (i.e. 4:00 PM Mass). Other days **may** be considered but in all instances the event must conclude by 10:00 PM. Also, we did not install a dance floor in the Parish Hall and that is a popular request for wedding receptions that we would not be able to accommodate.

We have learned that when renting our facility it is necessary for the renting party to provide insurance coverage to protect the parish. Renters will be required to provide Special Events liability insurance naming "Mary, Mother of the Church Parish, the Diocese of La Crosse, and Bishop William P. Callahan" as additional insureds. That coverage may be purchased through our insurance carrier, Catholic Mutual Insurance (for about \$95 per event), or *may* be available through an organization's liability insurance carrier or an individual's homeowner's insurance (check with your individual insurance carrier to be certain if that is available).

If alcoholic beverages *of any type* are to be served or sold, special Liquor Liability insurance must be secured (again, naming "Mary, Mother of the Church Parish, the Diocese of La Crosse, and Bishop William P. Callahan" as additional insureds). Certificates of insurance must be presented to the parish at least two weeks before an event.

The use of the Parish Hall and Religious Education Center requires a Building Rental Fee **and** a Security Deposit to be paid in advance at the time of booking the facility. The **Security Deposit** rate is the same as the Rental Fee. The Rental Fee is based on the priority of use schedule (A-D as above) and will be as follows:

Category:	A*	B	C	D
Parish Hall rental**	\$0	\$100	\$200	\$300
Religious Ed. Center rental**	0	100	200	300
Coffee Service	0	25	50	100
Use of Kitchen Equipment***	0	50	100	200
Use of Dishes & Silverware***	0	50	100	200

*Category A is for parish events and parish organizations of Mary, Mother of the Church (e.g. PCCW, Men's Club, and events e.g. Cookie Walk, Pancake Breakfasts, Parish Dinners, Funeral and Baptism luncheons, etc.). These organizations and events do **not** need to secure additional insurance or pay any rental fees. Loosely defined, a parish event would be open to all members of the parish and anyone who wishes to attend. The current parish insurance policies will provide coverage for these activities.

**Rental Fee covers utilities and a parish attendant for 4 hours. Any time over 4 hours is an additional \$25 per hour (any partial hour is considered a whole hour). A grace period of up to 1 hour for preparation and set-up prior to a scheduled event is permitted at no additional charge. However, extra clean-up time after an event is scheduled to end will incur the additional charge.

***A caterer – to be approved by the parish – may use designated kitchen equipment for warming, holding, and serving prepared food (i.e. warming/holding oven, upright refrigerator, upright freezer, chafing/serving dishes, sinks). For additional fees, separate arrangements may be made for the use of other kitchen equipment (i.e. stove, ovens, fryers, walk-in refrigerator, dishwasher), and/or dishes, and silverware.

As part of the rental agreement, Mary, Mother of the Church Parish will provide a "parish attendant" for the event. The attendant will be familiar with the general operation of the Parish Hall and Religious Education Center areas. The attendant will also be acquainted with the kitchen area and the use of that equipment. The attendant will be available to help in the event of a facility problem or to seek assistance if necessary. The parish attendant will lock the building at the conclusion of the event based on the time given in the rental agreement. No event may continue past 10:00 PM.
