

All Souls Day A Mass for the Dead will be celebrated on All Souls' Day, Saturday, November 2, in the Saint Francis of Assisi Mausoleum Chapel of the Catholic Cemetery, 519 Losey Boulevard South, at 9:30am. A plenary indulgence, under the usual circumstances, can be gained for the souls in purgatory by the Christian faithful who, within November 1-8, devoutly visits a cemetery and prays for the dead. Father Konopa will be the celebrant. All are invited to attend.

Evening of Remembrance An Evening of Remembrance Prayer Service will be held on Monday, November 4 at 6:30 pm. Mary Mother of the Church will call to mind the souls of our departed loved ones, especially those parishioners who have had their funerals with us in the previous 12 months. All are welcome.

Book of Remembrance In the month of November – beginning with the Feasts of All Saints (Nov 1) and All Souls (Nov 2) the Family of God remembers the souls of



our departed loved ones. MMOC records the names of parishioners who have died in the previous 12 months in our Book of Remembrance. Everyone is invited to pray for them and to write the names of their own loved ones whose funerals have been in other places, especially those who have died in the last year. The Book of Remembrance will be in a place of honor near the Easter Paschal Candle for the majority of the month of November.

Pictures in Memory of Loved Ones On All Souls Day, November 2, we remember and celebrate our loved ones who have gone before us marked by the sign of faith. As part of this remembrance, we invite any and all to bring to church a picture of your family members or friends who have died and we will arrange them in church. This is not just for those who have died this past year; consider doing this if you have never done it before. Additional pictures will be added until the Nov 4 service. It would be helpful, but not necessary, if the picture is in a frame that could stand on its own. Simply place them in the box at the front entrance of church. Please make sure all pictures are marked with your name so we can return them to the rightful owners. The display will last through the Nov. 9-10 weekend.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/ reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. 



Building Our Future Together As of October 23






You may have noticed the 3 red flags along Weston St. by the driveway. The 2 flags closest to Weston St. mark the location of the new sign that will soon be erected. The third flag marks the spot where our flag pole will be installed. We have waited a long time for the necessary permits and design work to be finished...but **La Crosse Sign Company** says they hope to have the sign installed by Christmas!

Sometime in November they will have the cement base poured and the area prepped so that when the sign is done it will be an easier install. The sign will be illuminated with lights inside the structure. It will have 3 lines of changeable print so we can advertise special Mass times at Christmas and Holy Days, as well as special events like Cookie Walks, Pancake Breakfasts and Chicken Ques. A special contribution received some time ago from a donor has been on reserve and will cover the cost of the new sign and installation of the flag pole.
