Message from Deacon Sage – On September 23, I finished the round of six once-weekly BCG immunotherapy treatments for bladder cancer. A month later, on October 21 I had medical tests to evaluate the post-operative status of bladder cancer. I was once again advised the bladder was clear and there was no evidence of new tumor growth. Again, wonderful news! Accordingly, I now go into an open-ended “maintenance” phase of check-ups every three months to make sure there’s no re-occurrence. Mary and I are so grateful for your prayers and support during this medical journey. We feel very fortunate and are grateful for God’s blessings and mercy. Thank you all so very much!

His perfect love has brought me incredible joy, and it’s a joy I want to share with the world. Part of this happiness is a deep desire to explore our Lord’s priesthood. Through this year and my time with you, I believe Christ will help me to discover my vocation.

Building Our Future Together

The value of legacy has a special impact on us this time of year. During November we remember our deceased loved ones and pray for them, especially on All Souls Day (Nov. 2) and Veterans Day (Nov. 11). We also begin preparations for Thanksgiving and Christmas, and we remember our family traditions. Legacy is part of our family living.

Last month we began the general campaign for Phase IV of Building Our Future Together. The goals of Phase IV are to provide care and attention to our beautiful church, address deferred maintenance, install energy efficiencies, and provide some updates to **the buildings that are a legacy to us from our early parishioners.** We have done much over the past few years in Building Our Future Together and we are all very grateful to everyone who made our new Parish Hall and Religious Education Center become a reality.

Now our attention is drawn to maintain and improve the facilities that were passed down to us by the sacrifices of early parishioners.

Summarily, the first item to be addressed is sealing the buildings from water infiltration... roofs, windows and masonry repair. The second addresses utilities...replacing the heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems; lighting improvements for the church, and water utilities. These first two items are the most critical and the most expensive...estimated cost is about \$2.4 million. However, the campaign has not yet reached the \$2.4 million needed to accomplish these first two needs. The other items in Phase IV total another \$1.4 million and they will be addressed later as particular needs are prioritized and funds become available.

During this November, in addition to remembering our deceased loved ones and family members, please also remember our parish family members who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. As you give prayerful consideration to making your commitment to the parish and the Building Our Future Together Campaign, may God bless you and your loved ones abundantly!
