

Blessing of Candles Feb. 2 is known in the United States as Groundhog's Day. This "holiday" might be interesting to many and even celebrated by some, but this date has much greater significance in our liturgical calendar. It's the 40th day after Christmas.

In accord with the Law of Moses, Mary went to the temple in Jerusalem for the purification ceremony and to present baby Jesus to the Lord. Simeon, a devout Jew, was moved by the Holy Spirit to approach the Holy Family. He took Jesus into his arms and thanked God for seeing the "light" of salvation with his own eyes (Luke 2:22-40).

For centuries the Church celebrated this event by blessing and "light"-ing candles. As Dec. 25 became known as Christmas (Christ-Mass), so Feb. 2nd became known as Candlemas (Candle-Mass).

Due to the pandemic, we will not have a procession with lighted candles at the 7:30am Mass, but there will be a blessing of candles in the sanctuary. Anyone who wants a blessed candle is welcome to bring their candle(s) to church, place it on the table in the sanctuary before Mass begins, and retrieve it at the conclusion of Mass.

Blessing of Throats February 3 is marked as the memorial of St. Blaise, a bishop of Armenia who was martyred around 316 AD when Christianity was still outlawed. When he was arrested, he ministered to fellow prisoners and even healed them. One day a child who was choking on a fish bone was brought to him and he saved him. This famous story led to the blessing of throats on the feast of St. Blaise. Traditionally, candles from Candlemas Day were used in the blessing of throats. Two candles are crossed in the shape of an X and placed on the shoulders of those to be blessed. The Church still encourages the blessing of throats through the intercession of St. Blaise but asks that candles only be used when blessing people as individuals, not as a congregation. Due to the pandemic, this blessing will be offered for the congregation at the 7:30 am Mass: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness.

World Day for Consecrated Life Women and men called to consecrated life take vows of chastity, poverty, and obedience to live their baptismal promises more intensely. We celebrate them in a special way on Feb. 2, the Presentation of the Lord, when Jesus was identified as the Light of the World because they reflect the light of Christ for us as we live our baptismal promises. Please pray for all those who have made commitments in the consecrated life as religious order sisters, brothers, and priests and as consecrated virgins. In a special way, MMOC gives thanks for Sr. Kathy Stuttgen FSPA and Sr. M. Donna Krzmarzick for reflecting the light of Christ... and for all religious who frequent our Masses. Sr. Kathy is a staff member who leads our Ministry with the Elderly and Sick; Sr. Donna is a parishioner who is the Director of the Diocesan Office of Consecrated Life.

Ash Wednesday Mass with Distribution of Ashes will be at Noon and 5:30 PM on Feb. 17. There will be no 7:30am Mass. The noon Mass will be livestreamed.

Lent Collection St. Clare Health Mission has been chosen for our 2021 Lent Collection. The mission started 28 years ago to serve the new population of Hmong that arrived in La Crosse. Today it continues its mission by serving the uninsured, underinsured, at-risk, and vulnerable in our community and in the surrounding area. Over the years St. Clare Health Mission has registered and helped over 18,000 clients obtain the health care they need. New initiatives are underway! In conjunction with the Scenic Bluff Clinic of Cashton, mental health and dental services are being set up. In collaboration with La Crosse health care providers, a street medicine team has been providing help to the homeless on a weekly basis. The Health Mission's next goal is partnering with Rotary International and local Rotary clubs to purchase a Mobile Medical Clinic. This unit will reach persons who are unable to travel to La Crosse. Let's lend our financial support to maintain their good work and to fulfill their new dreams as they reach those among us who are on the margins.

Wisconsin Bishops Issue Statement on Morality of COVID-19 Vaccines There are three COVID-19 vaccines that are available (currently only for the most vulnerable populations), or likely to be available in the coming months. They are from Pfizer, Moderna, and AstraZeneca. Neither Pfizer nor Moderna used morally compromised cell lines in producing the vaccine, but they did use a morally compromised line (from kidney cells taken from an aborted child in the Netherlands in 1972) for confirmatory testing. The AstraZeneca vaccine used that cell line in the design, development, and production stages of that vaccine, as well as for confirmatory testing. Where possible, then, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are to be preferred. But the US Bishops

Conference has recently stated that all three are morally permissible because of the remoteness of the material cooperation in the evil of abortion. Catholic moral theology has always made a distinction between formal and material cooperation in an act which is morally compromised. Formal cooperation with a moral evil such as abortion is always sinful. An example of this kind of cooperation might be the doctor or nurse who directly assists with, and intends, the abortion itself. Material cooperation can be different in that it does not intend the evil act and is often more distant or remote from the act itself. Saint Joseph

Year of St. Joseph The Diocesan "Year of St. Joseph" has been extended to Dec. 8, 2021 in conjunction with Pope Francis' proclamation of a "Year of Saint Joseph" from Dec. 8, 2020 to Dec. 8, 2021 (Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde*: "With a Father's Heart"). This year recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. The Holy Father wrote *Patris Corde* against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

33-Day Consecration to St. Joseph March 19 is the Solemnity of Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Consider participating in a 33-day retreat, which is contained in one book: *Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father* by Fr. Donald Calloway MIC. This retreat is done at home. Weekly discussions will be held in the Parish Hall with Fr. Konopa on Mondays at 6:30 - 8:00 PM from Feb. 15 to March 15 for those who wish to attend. Consecration Day is Friday, March 19. There's likely to be two options that day: after the 7:30 AM Mass and an evening ceremony. Books will be available for purchase in Feb. Please watch for an update in future bulletins.

Building Our Future Together

On January 21, we held a joint meeting via zoom with the Building Our Future Together Commission, the parish Finance Council, and the parish Pastoral Council to review the updated status and priorities of potential 2021 projects. Summarily, we have about \$1,660,000 in remaining Phase IV projects and we anticipate we will have about \$955,000 in cash available in 2021. Phase IV was a 3-year pledge and fund raising period. Thus, we will have about \$500,000 in pledges remaining due in 2022. At this time, we may not have sufficient funds to accomplish all the identified projects in Phase IV.


Last week in this article, we mentioned that we have been doing background work examining some of the possible building projects we may consider for 2021. At the joint meeting on January 21, we identified 3 priority areas: 1) projects aimed at "Sealing the Building Shell – Church & Rectory," 2) repairs and renovations in the rectory, and 3) a new tractor with a broom and plow. There was a consensus among the council members to proceed with those 3 projects at a cost estimate of about \$586,000.

We began a discussion on the remaining projects considering the advantages of "bundling" certain areas for efficiency. For example, one of the elements of "Sealing the Building Shell" is to strengthen and repair the stained glass windows. Therefore, in the area of Church Interior Renovations, it would seem timely to proceed with "Repair/Paint ceilings and Window Areas". Then due to scaffolding and/or lifts that are needed it may make sense to remove pews for refinishing. That would trigger the opportunity to strip and refinish the floors. And the list of combination possibilities continues. Fowler & Hammer is continuing to obtain cost updates for some of the proposed projects. Soon, these three consultative groups will help to finalize recommendations for 2021 projects.

Financially, we are able to do about \$369,000 in additional projects during 2021 with available cash. However, we may consider a short-term "bridge" loan from the Diocese to cover costs to accomplish some of the other church interior projects that may make sense to do while we are under pandemic restrictions and have limitations on church use. The bridge loan would not exceed the amount of outstanding pledges. We have proposed that in the past, but we have never had to obtain a loan to complete any of the BOFT projects. Parishioners have been very generous and faithful in completing their pledges.

We are most grateful for your goodness and are thankful for the many gifts and sacrifices you have made to make these repairs and improvements to our parish fabric. THANK YOU!
