

OUR MISSION

Mary, Mother of the Church parishioners are called to be the People of God, formed by the Holy Word and nourished by the Holy Eucharist. We joyfully share our faith and gifts of time, talent, and treasure. We are committed to serve all God's people in the building of the Kingdom.

Ash Wednesday Mass with Distribution of Ashes will be at Noon and 5:30 PM on Feb. 17. There will be no 7:30am Mass. The noon Mass will be livestreamed. KQEG will broadcast Mass at 4:00pm. Holy Trinity Parish will offer Mass at 8am and 7pm.

Distribution of Ashes The Congregation for Divine Worship in Rome recently released the following instructions for the distribution of Ashes during the present pandemic conditions: "The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: 'Repent, and believe in the Gospel', or 'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return'. The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything."

The US Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship continues: "These changes minimize the necessity of physical contact between minister and recipient and remove the need for the minister to speak while in close proximity to the recipient. The distribution of ashes via sprinkling is a common practice in some countries but is not well known here. Therefore, the Committee encourages ministers to provide some explanation to the faithful, to avoid unnecessary confusion."

As the Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship notes, while sprinkling ashes upon the top of the head is not customary in the United States, this legitimate manner of giving ashes is practiced in other countries around the world. The Ash Wednesday texts from the Missal themselves speak variously of ashes "put on our heads" "receive[d] upon our heads," and "place[d] on the head." The practice also recalls Old Testament accounts of "the Israelites gathered together while fasting and wearing sackcloth, their heads covered with dust" (Nehemiah 9:1)

Lent Collection St. Clare Health Mission has been chosen for our 2021 Lent Collection. The mission started 28 years ago to serve the new population of Hmong that arrived in La Crosse. Today it continues its mission by serving the uninsured, underinsured, at-risk, and vulnerable in our community and in the surrounding area. Over the years St. Clare Health Mission has registered and helped over 18,000 clients obtain the health care they need. New initiatives are underway! In conjunction with the Scenic Bluff Clinic of Cashton, mental health and dental services are being set up. In collaboration with La Crosse health care providers, a street medicine team has been providing help to the homeless on a weekly basis. The Health Mission's next goal is partnering with Rotary International and local Rotary clubs to purchase a Mobile Medical Clinic. This unit will reach persons who are unable to travel to La Crosse. Let's lend our financial support to maintain their good work and to fulfill their new dreams as they reach those among us who are on the margins.

Lenten Regulations The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17. Lenten regulations are as follows:

- 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

2021 MMOC Spiritual Renewal Days: "Going Deeper into our Identity: Making Progress in the Spiritual Life." This three-part series on March 1-3 (Mon-Wed) at 6:30 PM will be led by Terry Bell who is a member of the parish in the midst of his fourth year of formation to become a Permanent Deacon for the Diocese of La Crosse. He and his wife, Johanna, have been married for 14 years. They have four daughters: Felicity (13), Lydia (10), Faustina (7), and Sophia (1). Terry was not raised in any particular faith but had his conversion when he encountered God as a young adult. Soon after, he entered the military and was a member of several evangelical Christian communities before our Lord led him into the Catholic Church at age 23. Terry began to hear the call to a different mission after completing his second active-duty enlistment. Upon leaving the military, he studied theology and catechetics at Franciscan University of Steubenville, earned his degree, and became a FOCUS missionary. Currently, he is helping young adults at the University of Wisconsin - La Crosse to have their own encounter

"Going Deeper into our Identity: Making Progress in the Spiritual Life" will show how the supernatural progression in the spiritual life is analogous to the natural progression of family life. In this way, the goal is to enrich both one's relationship with God as well as one's relationship with family members (and others). On Monday, we will be discussing what it means to be a son or daughter of our Heavenly Father and how to live this reality as our deepest identity. On Tuesday, we will be looking at how this identity is meant to blossom through intimacy in a spousal relationship with God. There will be an emphasis on the nature of human intimacy and how to achieve it. On Wednesday, the series will culminate in a discussion on spiritual parenthood and bearing fruit through missionary service to others. And, in honor of the Year of St. Joseph, we will be highlighting how St. Joseph modeled each of these stages.

Lay Employees Retirement Fund This local, diocesan appeal supports the original retirement fund for former teachers, maintenance, hot lunch cooks, office and clerical workers who for many years worked in the schools, parishes, and offices within the Diocese of La Crosse. The funds collected will stay in the diocese to support retirement benefits for many people that you may know. About 50 years ago the Diocese established a lay employees' retirement fund to recognize the many years of service provided to the local church from its lay employees. The retirement program was funded by parish contributions, but from the beginning struggled to obtain sufficient assets to meet the projected actuarial need. In 2006 the "old" plan was "frozen" (meaning no new members could be enrolled) and a new 403b thrift plan was established. The "new" plan is performing well. However, the "old" plan is rapidly being depleted and is not sufficiently viable to support the promised retirement benefit to the approximately 1,500 former employees within the diocese. For the next several years, the parishes and institutions of the Diocese are being asked to make much larger contributions than previously assessed in order to sustain the former retirement fund for lay employees. This annual appeal will assist in meeting the needs of this fund. Please be generous! Thank you!






