Houska Park Meals for the Homeless A small group of volunteers has been looking for volunteer groups to help provide one hot meal per day through at least September, perhaps October, at Houska Park for our neighbors experiencing homelessness. Here are some details:

- Approximately 80-90 meals are needed each day.
- Water and/or beverages are very welcomed as there is only one water fountain in the park.
- There are two coolers (that remain in the park) available for beverages and packed meal leftovers. Please bring ice if you are able.
- Meals can be pre-packed in individual serving containers or served buffet style. Buffet style is the more typical method. Leftover food may be placed in individual storage containers and left in coolers with ice.
- Groups should bring all needed disposable plates, silverware and napkins, and trash bags. There is no storage facility in the park.
- All serving dishes, utensils, and any food that cannot be properly stored in the coolers for later use must be taken out of the park when the mealtime ends.
- At least 4 volunteers should assist with serving the meal (including handing out pre-packaged meals).
- Any type of food may be prepared for the meal. Hot food, hot dogs, BBQ, tacos, or hot dishes are popular choices. Fruit (e.g. watermelon or cantaloupe) is also popular. Ice and water are essential. (Desserts are optional, there are several businesses who bring leftover donuts and cookies.)
- 2 – 6' tables are needed for serving food. Volunteers need to bring and remove the tables. (The parish has 2 tables that can be used for the meals.)
- Mealtime is Monday – Saturday 5:30 to about 6:30 or 7:00. And Sunday at 2:00 until about 3:00 or 3:30 in the afternoon. Food is served for an hour. Then a call goes out for “last call” and volunteers begin clean-up during that last half-hour.
- There are NO attendants or organizational people present. Volunteers who bring food are on their own in setting up and serving the meal. There is a group of homeless who typically help or advise how things should go.

Right now there are only 2 groups sponsoring a meal, the Place of Grace on Thursdays and Our Savior's Lutheran Church (Come to Supper group) on Tuesdays. (There is currently one volunteer who is cooking and preparing food every Monday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday!) Could MMOC provide this meal on Wednesdays? Please let us know if you think you will be able to volunteer. We have not yet made a commitment for a day.

Building Our Future Together

Last week we published a list of remaining Phase IV projects that have been deferred to 2022. Summarily, the 2022 Phase IV projects continue to focus on renovations and improvements to the church interior including renovating church washrooms, attention to several music ministry improvements in the choir loft, and organ repairs/improvements. Even though 2022 is several months away, we have been giving some early thoughts to next year's projects, as there may be some preparatory work needed. In particular, we wish to share some thoughts on the organ repairs/improvements.

Organ repairs/improvements have been on the schedule of Phase IV projects for years. We had originally estimated a potential cost of \$74,500 for the organ based on a proposal received 2 ½ years ago from the organ company that had been tuning our instrument. That price was their minimum. We also received other proposals that recommended repairs/improvements that were above \$125,000. Recently, we have received estimates that are in the range of \$236,200 to \$283,900 to restore the organ and add some recommended enhancements. Clearly, these new estimates are far above our budget expectations and we need to explore other alternatives.

A little history of our pipe organ. The organ was manufactured by the Wicks Organ Company, Highland, Illinois. We purchased it pre-owned from Our Savior's

Lutheran Church, Oconomowoc, WI and it was installed in our church in spring 1995. We do not have information on how old the organ was at the time of purchase, but the design and style of the instrument may date it to the 1950's or 60's. Wicks organs are not known as premier instruments – even though there were many Wicks organs produced. The Wicks Organ Company is recognized as an organ builder that created many small, more affordable instruments that were attractive to smaller congregations. The parish invested \$61,290 to purchase, move, and install the pipe organ. Special donations and memorials paid for it. The pastor, Father Fliss, notes in a letter to the parish in April 1995, "no monies have been used from the General Fund to purchase and install the organ."

At the time of the installation, the organ builder hired to do the work gave the parish several options to consider enhancing and updating the instrument. Two important items were declined: updating the console (\$9,000) and installing new solid state switching systems for the entire organ (\$17,150). In addition, the builder recommended several options that would improve the overall sound quality and tonal variety of the organ (\$52,190 if all the recommendations were accepted). Those options were also declined. Interestingly, the recommendations may indicate some original deficiencies and limitations of the instrument that are currently driving the higher cost estimates for repairs and improvements.

We will have more information on organ possibilities in next week's bulletin. Please keep our parish and the success of this year's projects in your prayers as we Build Our Future Together.
