NEEDED: Gift Bearers The ministry of the 3 Kings! We are asking for volunteers to bring the gifts of God's People to the altar: bread, wine, and the offertory basket. MMOC Small Faith-Sharing Groups This past weekend we heard Sarah Scarlet give testimony to her experience with the Catholic Christian Outreach small faith-sharing groups. She referenced how time spent deepening her relationship with Jesus Christ allowed her faith to move from her head to her heart. The CCO series takes group members on a 36-week journey of prayer, reflection, and sharing that allows them to recognize that God created us to be in a relationship with Him -- to be His sons and daughters -- and that we cannot be in that relationship without Jesus for He is our bridge to eternal life with the Father.

During the year, we move our faith from our heads to our hearts through reading scripture, participating in the sacraments, and cultivating a personal prayer life. We learn the immense value of Christian fellowship and the joy of embracing our call to service and witness to our fellow brothers and sisters. Are you ready to have your heart moved?

"I originally thought CCO would be a dry Bible study, but surprisingly it was quite the opposite. We did read from the Bible to prompt discussion, but most evenings were spent sharing how our own lives relate to the weekly topic."

"Over the past several years I had been struggling with how I could develop a more intimate relationship with Jesus. The CCO program has helped set me on a path to overcome that struggle." - Leanne Bentzen

"The most recent and dramatic season of conversion of my life happened within the past year, through participation in a CCO group. Each person in the group began assisting me in my spiritual growth, in new and beautiful ways, by sharing their gifts of leadership, scripture, prayer life, hope, joy, and charity." - Tammy Byington

"I learned that I want a closer relationship with God and I am much happier when I have that relationship, but it does take work and perseverance."

"Although we were in separate groups, this class was an awesome way to grow closer to Jesus and each other." - Kerry and Sue Groetsch

"It became apparent in dialogue that it is not enough to have been a 'good' person. Actually, it is not about what I want at all. I am called by God to be part of his plan. To discern my path to what God is telling me, for me, means that in addition to asking things of God in prayer, I need to be silent so that I can listen to God. As a Christian, I have gifts, freely given, and I have responsibilities. To fulfill those responsibilities, it is less about what I think I should do, and more about asking to be led by the Spirit in the path he opens for me." - Brad Sturm

"I realize Jesus is with me much more than I ever thought. We can talk to Him as a friend. Not only

telling Him our troubles, but praying, praising, and thanking Him for being with us."

Music Ministry

The mission of our Music Ministry is to support and energize the celebration of the Liturgy. In a spirit of encouragement, we welcome, engage and empower all who possess a love for music to share their talents in the praise of God! Come and join the song! If you love to sing, or have other musical talents, we would love to have you join us! There are many musical opportunities available: from our traditional Sunday Choir with weekly rehearsals to smaller ensembles that rehearse only before Mass to cantors and song leaders. There are several ministries with limited commitment.

New Life Choir - Provides music leadership and sung prayer at most funerals for those gathered. Limited rehearsal time. Daytime availability is helpful. To brush up the first rehearsals of the new year will be Tuesday, September 28 and Tuesday, October 5 both at 9am in the Music Room (lower level of the Parish Hall). Starting October 1, 2021 New Life will begin singing for funerals at MMOC.

Sunday Choir - Supports and energizes the congregation every other Sunday at the 10:00 am Mass as well as some Holy Days and special liturgies. Rehearsals are Tuesday evenings, September to May. The first rehearsal will be Tuesday, September 21 from 6:00-7:30pm in the Music Room (lower level of the Parish Hall).

Small Group - Meets for periodic weekend Masses and for other services, the small groups come together to lead the congregation from the front. This group meets for a short rehearsal immediately before the liturgy they are singing.

Cantor - Proclaims the Psalm in song and leads the congregation in sung prayer at weekend Masses and other services. It is important that the cantor has an ability to sing, to read music and to inspire the congregation to sing.

Song Leader - Leads and engages the congregation when the choir is singing. They announce and confidently let the congregation know when to start singing (with help from the director and the choir). No solo singing is required.

Building Our Future Together


Last week's article brought forth the idea of replacing our current pipe organ with a new digital organ. The pipe organ is in need of some significant repairs and improvements that are very expensive. Even with those investments, we would still have an overall modest 60-70 year old pipe organ that requires annual maintenance and semi-annual tuning. Replacing the pipe organ with a new digital organ does bring up another question, what do we do with the current pipe organ?

Knowing that the current instrument is badly in need of repairs and improvements, our first thought was to offer to give the organ away. While that was a noble idea, we asked two pipe organ companies in Minnesota, one in Milwaukee, and one in Madison and there was no interest. In fact, only 1 of the 4 companies expressed any interest in coming to remove the instrument if we would pay them \$5,500 to do it – the others were not interested even if we paid them to take it. The reasons given were understandable and practical: pipe organs have gotten expensive and congregations simply cannot afford them as much as in the past, there is no market for used organs of this type. The instrument is in too poor a condition, we would need to invest too much to get it re-built; we do not have the warehouse space to store the old pipes until someone else may want them. Our question remained unanswered, what do we do with the current pipe organ?


The answer came when we turned the question to the only organ consultant who would remove it for a fee: Un-

less there was something unique and valuable about an old organ, the answer was "salvage and recycle." After additional thought and discussion we decided rather than pay \$5,500 to someone to essentially salvage and recycle the instrument we could do that as an in-house, parish sweat-equity project and save the money. Accordingly, Andy Foley, our Director of Building and Grounds, will organize a group of volunteers sometime this fall to begin the process of dismantling the old organ. This will also be a first step in getting the choir loft area opened up and ready for further renovation work as we look ahead to 2022 and the last of the Phase IV projects.


