

## Made for More: High School Retreat Saturday, October 28

#### Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a program for the religious formation of children rooted in the Bible and the liturgy of the Church. In this program, the 3-6 year old child will encounter Jesus as the Good Shepherd; who loves them, cares for them, and knows them by name. This is accomplished through prayer, listening to Scripture, and giving the child time to work with hands-on materials. Each of the materials presented are linked to either a specific part of the Mass or the Bible, which help to make the mystery of God concrete for the child. To participate, children must be at least three years old by November 1, 2023. Space is limited to 10 children per session. Registration is \$50 per child. If this is a burden, please reach out!

### Eucharistic Revival

### Two Minutes with Jesus for Eucharistic Revival

1. As Catholics, we believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist.

We humbly give our assent to what has been handed on to us for the last 2,000 years through the one Church that Jesus founded. This assent (giving our "yes – I choose to believe") involves our commitment to persistence in prayer and study of Scripture in asking Jesus for deeper understanding regarding His true Presence in the Eucharist. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Lord Jesus, "I believe; please help my unbelief." This week, read how a father gives his assent to believing that Jesus can heal his son in Mark 9:20-27.

2. As you take "steps forward," your faith in Jesus' true Presence in the Eucharist will grow.

We cannot simply convince ourselves through reason that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. One of the best ways to grow in this faith is to spend some time in conversation with Jesus, truly present in a Catholic Church. Go there and share something with the Lord that is on your heart. You will notice that probably without saying or feeling anything special, you will leave with a quieted heart. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, help me commit to spending some time in conversation with you in Church. This week, read about how we can always find Jesus in His Father's house in Luke 2:41-51.

### **Catholic Charities Warming Center**

The Warming Center will again be serving homeless adults at 413 South 3rd St., downtown La Crosse from November 1 through April 30. The Warming Center depends on volunteers to fill a variety of functions. Some provide supper, others register the guests as they check in, check their belongings and get them settled for the night while others come on duty in the early morning as the guests have breakfast and prepare for their day.

Mary, Mother of the Church will provide volunteers for the first, third and fifth **Tuesday** evenings of the month. The following are the 14 nights of service: Nov. 7 & 21; Dec. 5 & 19; Jan. 2, 16 & 30; Feb. 6 & 20; March 5 & 19; and April 2, 16 & 30.

Each night we need volunteers for the following service and times: Food for 40 people plus milk to be delivered by 6:30 PM. Six intake people from 6:30 - 8:30 PM. Two early morning people from 6:00-8:00 AM. We will NOT be staffing the over-night hours.

The staff at the Warming Center is encouraging volunteers to attend one **orientation** and **training session:** Wed. Oct 11 from 8-10 AM; Monday Oct 16 from 5-7 PM, Thurs. Oct 19 from 6-8 PM. Every new and veteran volunteer needs to attend one of these training sessions.

### The Rule of Saint Francis - 800 Year Anniversary





The Rosary is prayed before each weekday Mass Tuesday through Friday beginning at 7:05 AM. I wrote a bulletin article two weeks ago which highlighted Deacon Terry Bell's move from part-time to full-time status on parish staff. Last week's article included his autobiographical faith journey. This article speaks about a bigger view: The **New Evangelization** and the multiple ways it has reached our parish.

What is evangelization? Evangelization is sharing one's life in Jesus Christ with others. "The New Evangelization calls each of us to deepen our faith, believe in the Gospel message and go forth to proclaim the Gospel. The focus of the New Evangelization calls all Catholics to be evangelized and then go forth to evangelize. In a special way, the New Evangelization is focused on 're-proposing' the Gospel to those who have experienced a crisis of faith... The New Evangelization invites each Catholic to renew their relationship with Jesus Christ and his Church" (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops website).

Vatican II (1962-65) spoke of the need for evangelization. Pope Paul VI (1963-78) used the term "New Evangelization" in his 1975 apostolic exhortation *Evangelii nuntiandi* (Evangelization in the Modern World). And Pope John Paul II (1978-2005) popularized the term beginning with an address in 1983, saying the New Evangelization would be "new in its ardor, methods and expression."

With this encouragement – and the working of the Holy Spirit – many new initiatives (i.e. programs, organizations, religious communities, etc.) have awakened in the Church, and a handful of them have reached our parish:

- -Little Blue Books, Little Black Books & Little White Books: We purchase these daily reflection booklets for Advent/Christmas, Lent & Easter from the Diocese of Saginaw, MI for free distribution.
- **-Catholic Christian Outreach**: CCO helps participants place Jesus at the center of their lives and to be commissioned by Him for service. Over 140 people have participated in 18 CCO small faith-sharing groups since 2019.
- -Catherine of Siena Institute: The "Called & Gifted" workshop helps adults discern their unique charism-gifts received in Baptism and Confirmation to help them become effective and fruitful in the personal mission God has given to each of them. 48 people have participated in two workshops in 2023.
- -Augustine Institute: FORMED.org is a web-based platform of talks, movies, animation, books on tape, etc., which gives us access to a variety of content that fits into our personal schedules. We have used their "Lectio" bible studies since 2018 (once we built our Parish Hall), including our current "Lectio Eucharist" offering.
- -Families Forming Disciples: This family-based faith formation replaced the traditional religious education/CCD classes last year. In this new model, parents participate for personal growth in their faith and become equipped to lead faith formation activities for their children at home.
- **-Dynamic Catholic**: Matthew Kelly founded an organization which encourages us to become the-best-version-of-yourself and to "Be Bold. Be Catholic." Periodically, we have

ordered 1,000 books for Christmas gifts to all who attend Mass during this liturgical season.

Another new method and expression of the New Evangelization is the **Fellowship of Catholic University Students** (FOCUS). They send missionaries to college campuses. Now that they have begun sending veteran missionaries to parishes, it's worth understanding the "new method and expression" they use for the New Evangelization.

FOCUS' primary format is called THE LITTLE WAY in imitation of Jesus. While He drew large crowds and did much of His teaching and healing in these venues, He invested more time and energy in smaller groups: His disciples. AND while He had many disciples, He invested more into 12 who became the foundation of the Church and were among the chief missionaries to establish the Kingdom of God. It's also worth noting, that Jesus invested even more into <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/jht

While Jesus spoke to the multitudes – THE BIG WAY – He also invested extra time and energy into a small band. Being part of a small group is life-enriching, life-sustaining, and life-changing. A clear example is family life! We grew up with a mom and dad and perhaps a sibling or more. Small groups offer sustainable support – to know and to be known. The Little Way is an essential piece for spreading the Gospel to the entire world. This new method and expression is very ancient, too! The Little Way is a core principal for the way FOCUS lives the New Evangelization. Big events that last an evening or even a series of weekly gatherings? Sure! Little groups that might last a lifetime? Absolutely!

Another point of emphasis for FOCUS is to help each believer to become a missionary just as Jesus turned His student-disciples into missionary-apostles, or, as Pope Francis likes to say, "Missionary Disciples."

Another opportunity has arisen for us. St. Bronislava Parish in Plover (near Stevens Point) is hosting **Divine Renovation**, an organization which helps parish leaders reimagine parish life that is centered on allowing Jesus and the Holy Spirit to lead us so we are following the Great Commission to "make disciples"...and to help *those* disciples make new disciples, so we are all living an abundant life in Jesus with a desire that everyone receive the same gift... a desire that we all put into action. Every one of us is called to become a missionary disciple.

The New Evangelization has been underway! Our parish vision – **His Life. His Mission. Our Focus.** – echoes the words of St. John Paul II: "I sense that the moment has come to commit all of the Church's energies to a new evangelization and to the mission *ad gentes* (to the nations). No believer in Christ, not institution of the Church can avoid this supreme duty: to proclaim Christ to all peoples" (John Paul II, *Redemptoris missio*, 3 in 1990).


