Lenten Regulations

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14. Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Little Black Books

Free Lenten booklets are available this weekend on a first come, first serve basis in the back of church. These books offer daily, 6 minute reflections on the parables of Jesus.

Anointing of the Sick Mass

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated on Feb. 27 at the 10:30 AM Mass (NO 7:30 AM Mass).

Those with the following health conditions should consider receiving the sacrament:

--heart condition

- serious ailment or disease
- elderly...notably weakened by age
- upcoming surgery due to illness/injury
- emotional affliction

Lenten Collection

Mary, Mother of the Church has a loyal band of volunteers who put Matthew 25:37 into action: "Lord, when did we see you hungry?" Their shared mission since 2021 is "To relieve the hunger of unsheltered people in La Crosse." In an atmosphere of authentic, Christian fellowship, they meet every Thursday (Nov. – April) in the parish kitchen at 2 PM for 2 hours to prepare one big meal for the Warming Center. However, they don't stop there! They also bring breakfast and enough sandwiches for the sheltered guests to share with others the next day.

These volunteers rely on The Hunger Task Force for the vast majority of their ingredients. Therefore, this organization will receive the funds from our 2024 Lent Collection. In 1996, they began their mission: The Hunger Task Force works to eliminate hunger by harvesting community resources and being the voice of the hungry. Hunger Task Force is a liaison between various organizations in our community to help them work cooperatively to alleviate hunger.

Each weekend, there will be updated information in the bulletin so we can learn about the issue of hunger and how The Hunger Task Force makes a difference.

A Minute With Jesus

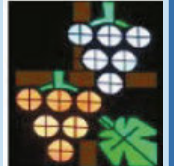

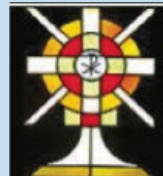
Year of the Eucharist: Spotlight on MMOC's Stained Glass Windows on the South (Left) Side of the Sanctuary



A: The stalks of wheat imposed on a cross symbolize the bread that Christ blessed and broke at the Last Supper. We recall his words at every Mass: "Before he was given up to death, a death he freely accepted, he took bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: 'Take this, all of you, and eat it, for this is my body which will be given up for you.'" During Mass, at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the priest says these words: "Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this bread to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life."



B: The bunches of grapes imposed on a cross symbolize the wine that Christ presented with these words: "When supper was ended, he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to his disciples and said: 'Take this, all of you, and drink from it. This is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.'" During Mass, at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the priest says these words: "Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this wine to offer, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become our spiritual drink."



C: The monstrance is used to enthrone the consecrated host at Eucharistic Adoration. When we place ourselves prayerfully in His presence we receive His grace, symbolized by the rays of light.
