Our diocese will welcome Bishop Battersby with Evening Prayers at 5 PM on May 19 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman. The installation the following day is a ticketed event, so the May 19 Evening Prayer is a fantastic opportunity to witness Bishop Battersby's arrival.

Shrines of Italy Pilgrimage

In 2025, a Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope, we will be heading to Italy! In addition to our pilgrimage to the Shrines of Italy, pilgrims may want to consider signing up for the pre-trip to Florence and Venice.

The journey begins from the US on Sept. 25 to Venice. We stay in Padua, which honors St. Anthony, "Patron Saint of Lost Things and Causes," and includes Mass at his Basilica and a visit to his tomb.

On Sept. 27, we visit Venice, the "city paved with water," which includes a walking tour of St. Mark's Square and the Golden Basilica of San Marco, which is known for the great mosaics that depict the Old and New Testaments of the Bible, and the afternoon for free time to explore Venice with a late return to Padua.

On Sept. 28, we visit Florence, the birthplace of the Renaissance and home to some of the most renowned artists: Dante, Leonardo da Vinci, Michelangelo, Raphael, Botticelli, and Donatello—an art lover's dream place. We will view the famous sculpture of Michelangelo, David and much more. On Sept. 29, a walking tour includes the Church of the Holy Cross, Piazza Signorina, and much more. The afternoon is free to explore Florence.

On Sept. 30, we go to Siena, the birthplace of St. Catherine of Siena, a Doctor of the Church, and St. Bernadine, the Apostle of Italy. We will enjoy lunch, a walking tour, and some additional free time before meeting the rest of our group in Assisi.

Mosaic of Mary, Mother of the Church

Our mosaic has arrived!

For the past few weeks, we have been exploring the importance of having a prominent image of Mary, Mother of the Church in our church building, the reasons we chose to represent this image through a mosaic, how mosaics are made, and specifically how our mosaic was created. This article will share the specific design elements of our mosaic.





As you look around our church, you will notice many sharp angles, including diagonals. For example, the altar's backdrop is rectangular in its lattice structure, the ceiling and outdoor pillars have raised diamond

shapes, and diagonals are prominent in our stained glass windows and flooring. These angles and shapes are reflected in the 3 panels and in the rays coming forth from the Holy Spirit as tongues


Finally, one of the stained-glass windows, located at the very top of one of the north windows, includes an
