



Welcome Bishop Battersby

Bishop Battersby was installed on May 20, 2024 at St.. Joseph the Workman Cathedral. The youngest of nine children, Gerard W. Battersby was born, along with his twin brother, on May 15, 1960. He grew up in northwest Detroit. In 1993, he entered Sacred Heart Major Seminary as an



adult vocation and received a Master of Divinity degree in 1998. He was ordained to the priesthood on May 30, 1998. He served in parish ministry for approximately ten years before being appointed to Sacred Heart Seminary, where he received a Licentiate in the New Evangelization in 2008. He served as director of graduate seminarians and graduate pastoral formation. In 2009, Father Battersby was assigned to graduate studies at the Angelicum in Rome, Italy. In 2011, he was appointed vicerector and dean of seminarian formation at Sacred Heart Major Seminary. Father Battersby was appointed as Auxiliary Bishop of Detroit on November 23, 2016 and his episcopal ordination occurred shortly thereafter on Jan 25, 2017. On March 19, 2024, His Holiness Pope Francis named Bishop Battersby as the 11th Bishop of the Diocese of La Crosse.

Shrines of Italy Pilgrimage

In September 2025, we will embark on a pilgrimage to the Shrines of Italy. Last week's bulletin article highlighted the "pre-trip" option to tour Florence and Venice. This week, we will focus on the core pilgrimage, which begins in Assisi. Pilgrims will arrive in Rome on September 30 and board a bus to Assisi. Our first night in Assisi will include a walking tour, meet-and-greet, and dinner.

On Oct. 1 we begin with a tour of St. Francis Basilica, visit his tomb, and view frescoes of his life. During our walking tour of Assisi, we will visit the tomb of Blessed Carlo Acutis, the birthplace of St. Francis, and the church that honors St. Clare. Following free time and lunch, a bus will take us outside the walls of Assisi to the Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels, the area where St. Francis spent most of his life.

On Oct. 2 we travel through the Umbrian mountains to Gubbio where St. Francis freed the town from a fierce wolf and, in 1224, received his stigmata. We will visit the Chapel of the Stigmata and the Basilica.

On Oct. 3 we begin our way to Rome, but we will have a few other notable highlights on the way! We will stop in Loreto to visit the Holy House of Nazareth and the beautiful Madonna of Loreto. We will celebrate Mass at the Church of St. Longinus in Lanciano, the site of a Eucharistic Miracle. Our final stop is San Giovanni Rotondo.

On Oct. 4 we will tour the sanctuary to view the crucifix in front of which St. Padre Pio received the stigmata. We will also see the confessional, where he spent innumerable hours hearing to confessions. We will visit the Grotto of St. Michael the Archangel on our way back to San Giovanni Rotondo. After some free time and dinner, you can participate in a candlelight procession and Rosary at the Sanctuary of St. Pio.

On Oct. 5, we will board the bus to travel to Rome. On

the way, we will stop in Pietrelcina to visit the birthplace of St. Padre Pio. Then, we will see the Abbey of Montecassino and the tombs of siblings St. Benedict and St. Scholastica. Finally, we will arrive in Rome!

Church was installed by Inspired Artisans mation, the children honored our Blessed Mother. the (Milwaukee). Fowler & Hammer did some finishing work, including installing the red votive candles taken from the Sacred Heart niche; the candles were located on the side walls after the pattern in the Sacred Heart niche.

The mosaic was first seen on the weekend of Pentecost (May 18-19), which is most appropriate since it depicts this glorious mystery. On the day after Pentecost our Patronal Feast Day - the mosaic was blessed during the 5:30 PM Mass.

We are grateful to the anonymous benefactor who covered the entire cost of the mosaic: \$72,250. What a generous gift! The Building Fund covered the other costs of pre-installation work, relocating votive candles, and surface repairs to these and other areas throughout the church.
