2025 Italy Pilgrimage - Logistics/Status

As we look forward to 2025 and our pilgrimage to the Shrines of Italy, you may be asking yourself a few questions. Are others already committed to going? Will we have enough to make it a go? What is included in the cost? How much planning and coordinating do I have to do?

Great questions!

First, yes, there are parishioners already signed up to go! We currently have 19 participants signed up for the Rome-Assisi pilgrimage, and 12 participants have committed to the Florence-Venice pre-trip.

The pilgrimage costs \$5,194/person, and the pre-trip is an additional \$1,978/person. These costs include round trip airfare from La Crosse, 8 nights of hotel accommodations (+4 nights of accommodations for the pre-trip), breakfast and dinner daily, wine and mineral water with dinners, motorcoach transportation while on pilgrimage, luggage handling, tips for hotel and restaurant staff, sightseeing and admission fees for all sights on the itinerary, and professional, local Catholic guides. Costs not included are lunches and beverages not mentioned, and the tips for the guide and bus driver.

The wonderful part of the pilgrimage is that most of the work is done for you! 206 Tours coordinates your itinerary, flights, meals, hotels, and transportation. You can spend your time learning about the Saints and sites we will be visiting, finding your passport, and relaxing!

To register for the pilgrimage and pay your deposit of \$400, visit www.206tours.com/frkonopa. The balance of the trip is due 90 days before your departure - July 1, 2025. There are also options to purchase various forms

of trip insurance; you may want to click on those options and research if one of these would be a wise choice for you. Music Ministry

Sunday Choir: Supports the congregation every other Sunday at the 10:00 AM Mass and some other services. Rehearsals are Tuesday evenings September to May beginning September 24 from 6:00 - 7:30 PM.


"God has no grandchildren?"


