#### Oremus

Last week's bulletin introduced an upcoming opportunity at Mary, Mother of the Church, **Oremus: A Guide to Catholic Prayer.** Potential obstacles to encountering the Lord in daily prayer, such as a lack of time, skill, knowledge, companionship, and fear, were also identi-



fied. This week, we will address these possible obstacles.

The first couple of sessions of Oremus help define prayer and the steps before praying. These lessons provide suggestions to help you make time for prayer alongside a group of fellow Christians to help you keep your commitment to daily prayer. Each participant is encouraged to commit 20-25 minutes to daily prayer.

The next several sessions focus on various forms of prayer – giving you the knowledge and skill to break open Scripture and learn to listen to God in your daily life. The Catholic Church has a rich tradition of prayer, which is rooted in lectio divina – "divine reading." Oremus will teach us how to pray using lectio divina. The

wonderful news is that if you want to start a daily prayer life, are just beginning to pray each day, or are looking to go deeper in your prayer, Oremus can be that guide to help you on the journey.

The fear of the unknown is quite real, but the Lord calls us to be brave and step out in a spirit of trust and confidence. As the new year approaches, has the thought of developing or deepening your prayer life stirred up some interest and excitement in you? Do you sense joy rising in your heart? That may be the Lord asking you to join Oremus. This week, let the idea expand in your heart. Ask the Lord where He is asking you to take a step in trust.

Oremus will meet on Tuesdays from 1:00 to 2:30 p.m. (starting January 7) **or** Thursdays from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. (starting January 9). The location will be determined based on attendance.
