### Italy Pilgrimage

2025 is a Jubilee Year – Pilgrims of Hope – and we will head to Italy! We will tour many holy sites and historic locations while visiting Rome, Assisi, and other cities. In addition to our pilgrimage to the Shrines of Italy, pilgrims should consider signing up for the pre-trip to Florence and Venice. Those attending the pre-trip will travel to Venice on September 25. Those partaking in the main portion of the trip will depart for Rome on Septem-

ber 30 and then travel by bus to Assisi, where they will meet up with the pre-trip travelers. On October 8, after an early breakfast, we will depart for the airport and return home. The pilgrimage costs \$5194/person, and the pre-trip costs \$1978/person. These costs include round trip airfare from La Crosse, 8 nights of hotel accommodations (+4 nights of accommodations for the pre-trip), breakfast and dinner daily, wine and mineral water with dinners, motor coach transportation while on pilgrimage, luggage handling, tips for hotel and restaurant staff, sightseeing and admission fees for all sights on the itinerary, and professional, local Catholic guides. Costs not included are lunches and beverages not mentioned, as well as tips for the guide and bus driver. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Luke 4:18-19). It is through Christ that we are to find freedom, forgiveness and joy.

# BLESSED BROTHER JAMES MILLER

BEATIFIED AS A MARTYR  
DECEMBER 7, 2019  
HUEHUETENANGO, GUATEMALA

## The Feast of Blessed Brother James Miller - February 13

A De La Salle Christian Brother from the United States, Blessed Brother James Miller devoted his life to education and missionary work in Central America.

Born into a farming family in Wisconsin on September 21, 1944, his upbringing instilled in him a deep sense of compassion and service to others. He attended Pacelli High School in Stevens Point, WI, where he first encountered the Christian Brothers and felt a calling to join their mission.

In 1959, while still a sophomore in high school, Brother James joined a program for young men considering a life dedicated to the Christian Brothers. Over the next three years, he delved deeper into the teachings and values of the Brothers, solidifying his commitment to their mission. He began his formal training with the Brothers and took on the name Brother Leo William, a testament to his devotion to the order.

After completing his training, Brother James embarked on his teaching career, starting at Cretin High School in Minnesota. Over the next few years, he taught Spanish, English, and religion while also coaching soccer. His passion for education and his dedication to his students made him a beloved figure in the school community.

In 1970, Brother James made his final vows as a Christian Brother and requested a mission assignment. He was sent to Nicaragua, a country torn apart by political unrest and social upheaval. Despite the challenges, Brother James immersed himself in the local community, teaching and leading schools and construction projects. He played a crucial role in building educational infrastructure and providing opportunities for the marginalized youth in Nicaragua.

However, escalating conflicts and threats from the regime forced Brother James to leave Nicaragua. Undeterred, he continued his mission in Guatemala, where he became the director of "Casa Indígena De La Salle," a school for indigenous youth in Huehuetenango. Here, he dedicated himself to providing education and hope to those who had been marginalized and oppressed by society.

James remained steadfast in his commitment to his faith and his mission. His unwavering dedication to serving the marginalized and oppressed in Central America serves as an enduring testament to his character and his values.

Tragically, on February 13, 1982, while Brother James was on a ladder repairing a wall at the school, he was assassinated by three masked gunmen. The murder occurred during a period of intense violence in Guatemala, characterized by the government's crackdown on suspected insurgents and their supporters, which often included church workers and humanitarians like Brother James.

The exact motives behind Brother James' murder remain unclear, though it is widely believed that his assassination was related to his work in empowering the marginalized Indigenous communities, which was perceived as politically and socially subversive by certain factions. His dedication to his faith and educational mission made him a target in a time of widespread persecution against those who stood up for social justice and human rights.

Brother James Miller's martyrdom has been recognized by the Catholic Church, and he was beatified on December 7, 2019. His legacy endures as a symbol of courage and unwavering faith in the face of oppression, inspiring many to continue the mission of serving those in greatest need.

Brother James Miller's life and legacy continue to inspire us today. His selfless devotion to others, his unwavering faith, and his ultimate sacrifice serve as a shining example of what it means to live a life of compassion and service. Through his actions and his words, Brother James's life inspires us by reminding us of the importance of compassion, service, and faith in making a difference in the world.
