

Lenten Regulations

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Lenten regulations are as follows:

- 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

NEEDED: Liturgical Ministers

Liturgical positions need to be filled for Ash Wednesday Masses and also for Holy Week. This includes Sacristans, Ministers of Holy Communion, Greeters, Gift Bearers, and Servers. Old Palms

If you are looking for a way to dispose of blessed palms, there is a box in the gathering space for this purpose. We will dispose of them in a proper manner. Traditionally, the ashes from blessed palms are used for Ash Wednesday.

Cold and Flu Season

There has been an increase in the amount of respiratory illnesses and flu in our area lately. In light of this, please use good judgment regarding attendance at Mass. If you are sick, i.e. running a fever, please remain safe at home. Likewise, please use reasonable caution and prudence when receiving the Precious Blood and sharing the Sign of Peace. Let's keep ourselves and others safe and illness free.

Restrooms

In the instance of using the restroom during Mass, the age-old advice serves well: Please use the bathroom before leaving home. "Go...before you go." But not all plans "go well"!

- Best times: before/after Mass, during hymns, Communion time, and other movements (i.e. while people are sitting down, standing up, etc.)
- Worst times: during the Scripture readings, homily, and Eucharistic prayer.

This holds true when returning from the restrooms. Children are asked to seek the guidance and permission of their parents.

When reminders like these are in the bulletin, it's a sign that we're a real family!

Italy Pilgrimage

2025 is a Jubilee Year - Pilgrims of Hope - and we will head to Italy! We will tour many holy sites and historic locations while visiting Rome, Assisi, and other cities. In addition to our pilgrimage to the Shrines of Italy, pilgrims should consider signing up for the pretrip to Florence and Venice. Those attending the pretrip will travel to Venice on September 25. Those partaking in the main portion of the trip will depart for Rome on September 30 and then travel by bus to Assisi, where they will meet up with the pre-trip travelers. On October 8, after an early breakfast, we will depart for the airport and return home. The pilgrimage costs \$5194/person, and the pre-trip costs \$1978/ person. These costs include round trip airfare from La Crosse, 8 nights of hotel accommodations (+4 nights of accommodations for the pre-trip), breakfast and dinner daily, wine and mineral water with dinners, motor coach transportation while on pilgrimage, luggage handling, tips for hotel and restaurant staff, sightseeing and admission fees for all sights on the itinerary, and professional, local Catholic guides. Costs not included are lunches and beverages not mentioned, as well as tips for the guide and bus driver. 
