
Divine Mercy Mosaic

The May 12, 2024, bulletin article provided a bit of history regarding the use of mosaics. This article has been updated and reprinted below to include images of the Divine Mercy mosaic.

At its very basics, mosaic art is the creation of patterns or pictures using small pieces of materials such as clay, marble, glass, tiles, or stones. These small pieces, called tesserae, are hand-cut by the artist using a mosaic hammer and hardie or tile nippers. The art of creating mosaics requires the artist to first sketch the basic design on the surface and choose the color patterns. Then, after applying a cement-like substance to adhere the tesserae into place, they arrange the tesserae to create their masterpiece.

The creation of mosaics dates back at least 4,000 years! The earliest mosaics found in Mesopotamia (present-day Iraq) were dated to the 3rd millennium BC. Early mosaics were difficult and time-consuming to create; thus, they were status symbols. They were often found in the king's palace and at the entries to the royal cities.


The earliest signs of Christian mosaic art, 320-330 AD, were intermixed into Roman mosaics depicting their gods. Until Christianity was made legal by Emperor Constantine, artists created these Roman mosaics and hid scenes from the Old and New Testaments within. During the Middle Ages (500-1500 AD), mosaics continued to be a popular art form used to adorn mausoleums, churches, and other important buildings. During these years, this artistry began to increase in intricacy, and the people depicted became more realistic in their appearance. Although mosaics lost their popularity during the Renaissance Period, St. Peter's Basilica honored this artistic tradition by choosing mosaics for its decor. Today, we can find mosaics in subways, restrooms, restaurants, and parks. They can cover walls, floors, ceilings, benches, or tables. Wherever mosaics are, this ancient



and elegant art form brings beauty and uniqueness.

Artists at Inspired Artisans in Milwaukee designed our mosaic, the sketch, and the full-size cartoon on paper. It's one-of-a-kind. The chosen tesserae was Venetian glass. Venetian glass is formed by combining three layers of glass, resulting in a deep, dimensional surface texture that uniquely captures light.

Computer-generated sketch A layer of hand-blown glass ensures that no two pieces are identical, and the original color will be the same for millennia. It was hand-blown in Venice. The three panels are made of at least 60,000 tesserae, with an average surface of 3/8 of an inch square. Due to the intricacies involved with this mosaic, such as the eyes, fingers, and lips of Jesus, Inspired Artisans commissioned an expert artisan close to Carrara, Italy. Schooled

in Ravenna – one of the few places in the world with this skill level. The Venetian glass was applied to honeycomb aluminum panels, except for a few strategic places, so the panels can be screwed into the stone wall of our church before being covered by the remaining glass.

If you are interested in the creation process of mosaics, you can find videos on YouTube! Next week's article will discuss the basic design elements of our Divine Mercy mosaic and share any updates on the project's progress.

As the preparation work continues and we await confirmation of shipment from Italy to Milwaukee, we ask Jesus to have mercy on us and on the whole world.
