Lenten Regulations

Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Silver Jubilee of our Parish

On Saturday, the mosaic of Divine Mercy is blessed at the 4:00 PM Mass and a celebratory dinner of meatballs and buttered noodles is served after the Mass at 6 PM. On Sunday, free donuts and a continental breakfast is served by members of Music Ministry in the parish hall after the 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM Masses. Let's celebrate the good things that have happened during the past 25 years as Mary, Mother of the Church looks forward to our future as we focus on His Life and His Mission.

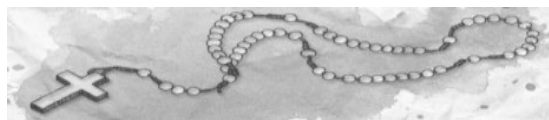

Divine Mercy Mosaic

Inspired Artisans installed the mosaic on Saturday, March 29, for the blessing this weekend as we celebrate our parish's Silver Jubilee. The small vigil candle sconces will be powder coated and installed later this month, and the Sacred Heart statue will be relocated to the hallway of the Parish Hall this spring.

This article focuses on the Corporal Works of Mercy: highlighting the seven medallions that depict how we are to bring the Mercy of Jesus to our neighbors in need, as Jesus shared with St. Faustina, "I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere" (Diary 742).

The Corporal Works of Mercy tend to the physical needs of others. Each medallion design was chosen to help us meditate on how to live these Works of Mercy. The red rays from Jesus' heart, representing His Blood, are life for souls and radiate through these medallions.

From top to bottom:

Feed the Hungry

Give Drink to the Thirsty

Welcome the Stranger (Shelter the Homeless)

Clothe the Naked

Visit the Sick

Visit the Imprisoned

Bury the Dead

The first six Works of Mercy come directly from Jesus' parable of the goats and sheep.

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory... the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them...He will place the sheep

on his right and the goats on his left.

Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.'

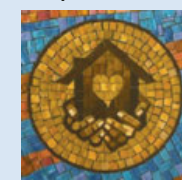
'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.'" Matt. 25:31-40.

The first image, Feed the Hungry, is represented by hands offering a loaf of bread. According to a recent COMPASS report, more than half of the Greater La Crosse Area students receive free or reduced lunches, and 1 in 3 people are considered poor or near poor. These statistics highlight the great need for our food pantries and other social services. We have baskets in the sanctuary at every weekend Mass (and holy day) for food, which is delivered to Catholic Charities. Also, our Matthew 25 group gathers on Thursday afternoons in our parish kitchen to extend this mercy to our community, especially through the Warming Center operated by Catholic Charities. As you meditate on this image, how can you bring God's mercy by providing food to your neighbor?

The image of hands offering a drink of water reminds us to Give Drink to the Thirsty. In our area, this need especially arises during the summer months. There are also non-profit organizations that seek to bring water to

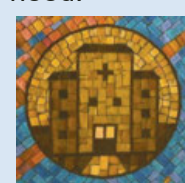
less developed areas of the world. Conservation and protection of our water resources is also an important effort to ensure the availability of clean water for future generations. How can you demonstrate God's mercy?

A place to call home is a struggle for some in our area.



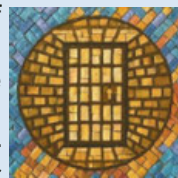
Our parish assists the Warming Center, which provides shelter from Nov. - April by covering the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Tuesdays of the month. Other local agencies and organizations seek to assist individuals and families in finding, securing, and furnishing a home. Many people simply need a welcoming smile or an invitation to belong, including those in our parish and families. (Thank you, parish Greeters!) As you meditate on the image of loving hands holding a home, how can you Welcome the Stranger and Shelter the Homeless?

Another basic need of each human is adequate and appropriate clothing. Jesus' call to Clothe the Naked reminds us to consider what excess we have in our closets that we could provide to Catholic Charities Men's Closet, the winter wear we can give to the Warming Center or the financial resources we could donate instead of spending on more for ourselves. As you gaze at this image, consider how to give to those most in need.

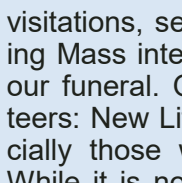


Visiting the Sick became impossible during the recent pandemic, and the deep need for personal touch and interaction became crystal clear. This need has not changed. Do you have a next-door neighbor who would love to visit over coffee? Do you have time to bring the Holy Eucharist to those in the hospital, home-bound, or in a nursing home?

The image of a jail door reminds us of the need to Visit the Imprisoned. Those serving sentences in our local jails are made in the image and likeness of God and thus have dignity as beloved daughters and sons of the Eternal Father. Our local Jail Ministry provides for their temporal and spiritual needs. They have many ways in which you can support their mission and donate materials. Take a moment to review their website, www.lacrossejailministry.org, and ask the Lord to show you how He desires you to extend mercy.




The final Work of Mercy is Bury the Dead, represented by the image of a casket and digging tools. Under significant risk to his own life, Tobit took it upon himself to ensure his people were honored with a proper burial (Tobit 1:18-19). Today, we can extend this same mercy to others by attending funerals and




visitations, sending cards to those in mourning, requesting Mass intentions for our loved ones, or even pre-plan our funeral. Our parish has a wonderful team of volunteers: New Life Choir, Greeters, and many others, especially those who serve dinners and provide desserts. While it is not easy to accompany the mourning or say goodbye to friends and family, being present to those in need is a great act of mercy.
